#### What is the **Central Harris County Regional Water Authority?**



The Central Harris County Regional Water Authority (CHCRWA) was created to meet the groundwater reduction mandates of the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District. Their primary mission is to provide a plentiful supply of surface water, promote water conservation, and educate the community about the precious resource of water. The CHCRWA preserves the region's limited groundwater supply and ensures a plentiful water resource to our residents for generations to come.

Judge Caston, a resident of Harris County MUD 217, was recently appointed to the Board of Directors of the Central Harris County Regional Water Authority. He previously served on the CHCRWA Board from 2005 to 2014.

The CHCRWA provides surface water to retail water providers to prevent sinking of the land surface caused by over pumpage of our limited groundwater resources. This sinking of the land surface is known as <u>subsidence</u>.

#### What is <u>Subsidence?</u>

Subsidence is the gradual sinking of the land surface over time. This sinking occurs when we overuse our groundwater supplies. Pumping too much groundwater lowers the groundwater level and causes the soil that holds water to physically compact. Soil compaction permanently reduces the space in soil that can store water, threatening our future groundwater supplies.

When subsidence happens, our land surface is lowered, resulting in changing drainage patterns that increase the likelihood and severity of flooding. Because subsidence causes movement of the land surface, it also contributes to costly infrastructure damage.

#### Since 1915, the Houston area has seen over 9ft of subsidence (according to USGS).

## **COMMISSIONER'S CORNER**



As Commissioner of Harris County Precinct One, Rodney Ellis has played a critical role on the Court by securing misdemeanor bail reform, flood equity guidelines, stronger worker protections and economic opportunity

provisions, funding for indigent defense and COVID-19 recovery funding, including direct relief for residents, small businesses, emergency rental assistance, shelters for those experiencing homelessness, as well as other innovative programs, including providing computers to low-income students, among other achievements.

Harris County Commissioner Rodney Ellis was born and raised in Houston's Sunnyside neighborhood. Before serving as a County Commissioner, Ellis was elected to Houston City Council and served three terms before being elected to the Texas Senate in 1990. For 26 years, he represented Texas' 13th state senate district and he passed over 700 pieces of legislation. On November 8, 2016, Ellis was elected county commissioner and sworn into office on January 1, 2017.

As County Commissioner, Ellis prioritizes inclusive economic growth that uplifts low income communities, ensures access to parks and green-space in under-served neighborhoods, advances criminal justice reform that protects the rights of all people, and provides safe, affordable transportation options. Following Hurricane Harvey, Ellis successfully advocated for equitable investment in flood control infrastructure and disaster recovery in vulnerable communities through a \$2.5B bond approved by voters in 2018.
